Thursday 3rd Corpus Christi	Give thanks and pray for all who work in our public services
Friday 4th	Pray for our Parish Councils. That they would be cohesive and serve the common good.
Saturday 5th	Pray for all those waiting for hospital treatment; those waiting to see consultants; those waiting for the results of tests. This can be a very testing time.
Sunday 6th Trinity I	Pray for our all our Village communities. Pray for those being baptised today.
Monday 7th	For everyone returning to School today after half term. Particular prayers for those children who will move on at the end of this term – that they will make good memories.

Wednesday 9th	Pray for those who work in our local businesses
Thursday 10th	Pray for residents and staff at Le Grand Luce Court
Friday 11th Barnabas	Today is a day on which we remember the apostle Barnabas. Barnabas was known as an 'encourager'. Give thanks for those who have encouraged you.
Saturday 12th	This week-end our Govt is hosting the 47 th G7 gathering of world leaders. Pray for them.

Sunday 13th Trinity 2	This week-end our Govt is hosting the 47 th G7 gathering of world leaders. Pray for them again!
Monday 14th	<p>Today work begins to build a toilet at Cherry Willingham. Please pray for the smooth running of this Project.</p> <p>There are more Govt announcements today. Pray particularly for those who have not been able to open their businesses, as yet, as they wait for news.</p>
Tuesday 15th	Pray for those you know whose mental health has suffered over this last year. Pray how best you may support them.
Wednesday 16th	Pray for the displaced, for refugees and economic migrants
Thursday 17th	Pray for those who are trafficked, powerless and controlled. Pray for those organisations such as Hope for Justice who work to be advocates for those who are trafficked. Pray for perpetrators that they may find a different path.
Friday 18th	Pray for those who are victims of domestic abuse, children and adults. Pray for the Police and for Local Authorities and Charitable organisations who provide support.
Saturday 19th	Pray for the learning disabled – that they might always find the support that they need, and may they know that they are held in the palm of God's hand.
Sunday 20th Trinity 3	Today we hear in the Gospel of Mark, of Jesus stilling the storm. We all experience life's storms – pray for yourself or anyone you know experience a storm of life. Pray the peace of Jesus on them.
Monday 21st	Jess Bellshaw begins the process of moving into the Rectory to Fiskerton today. Pray for her and her family as they move, that Fiskerton will soon become home.
Tuesday 22nd	Today pray 'Come Holy Spirit' and ask God to fill you afresh with all that He has to give. May He refresh your gifts and equip you to do all that you are called to do.

Wednesday 23rd	Pray for the growth of the Church – in depth and in number. Ask the question of yourself – what am I doing to enable this to happen – and then pray.
Thursday 24th The Birth of John the Baptist	Today we remember the birth of John the Baptist. Give thanks for Stainton by Langworth – its village and church community, dedicated to John. Give thanks for the ministry of John the Baptist – often seen as a strange character but who prepared the way for Jesus and preached the way of the Kingdom of God.
Friday 25th	Pray for staff and patients at St Barnabas Hospice, for their Day Care centre and Home Support Services. Pray for Marie Curie Nurses and MacMillan Cancer Care.
Saturday 26th	Pray for someone you haven't seen or heard from for a while and then pick up the phone and call them and tell them you prayed for them today.
Sunday 27th Trinity 4	Start your prayers today with thanksgiving and gratitude – for all that is good in your life and for your surroundings and then give thanks to God for Jesus.
Monday 28th	Remember the homeless in prayer. For those sofa surfing, For those who have become prisoners of addiction.
Tuesday 29th Peter and Paul	Today we remember Peter and Paul. Two of our churches are dedicated to these two apostles – pray for Reepham and Cherry Willingham Churches and their Communities. Give thanks for the ministry of Peter and Paul who pioneered the planting of churches and preached the good news of Jesus.
Wednesday 30th	Pray for Jess Bellshaw as she is ordained in three days time.... As she retreats, may this be an important time of preparation.
